The Schools Forum considers proposals drawn up by Bristol City Council to allocate the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG) from the Department for Education and is earmarked for education funding in Bristol. The Schools Forum is interested in how the budget for education is spent, to ensure that it understands the "wider" picture. The Forum will be seeking to understand the financial implications of various initiatives, such as the inclusion programme of placing special schools alongside secondary schools and the creation of further academy schools. The Schools Forum is unable to 'champion' any individual causes, because of its role to consider local authority proposals, but is always interested to be advised of issues.
